Andy Cech began playing tuba at the age of 11. He has experience playing in concert bands, symphony orchestras, brass quintets, tuba-euphonium ensembles, trombone choirs and brass choirs. Andy's musical career took off in high school when he auditioned for the All-Star High School Tuba-Euphonium Ensemble at the 2002 International Tuba-Euphonium Conference in Greensboro, North Carolina. Andy is an active composer, having chamber works performed at the International Tuba-Euphonium Conference, the Ohio University Student Composition Recital, and the Ohio University Wind Ensemble 2010 Winter Concert.
